

Recruiter Introduction Letter Kit

Introduce your experience with a specific role, a credible achievement, and a clear request.

Make the introduction useful

Choose the version that fits your situation. Replace every bracketed field and remove optional lines you do not need. Verify achievements against your own records. Name a role family and geographic preference. Link a portfolio only when you have permission to share the work. Attach a resume only if the message says it is attached. Review the recipient and send personally when ready.

Experienced professional letter

Subject: [Target role] professional with experience in [specialty]

Returning to work letter

Subject: Returning to [target role or field] in [geography]

Short email versions

Send one considerate follow-up after a reasonable interval. Respect a decline or request to stop.

Fictional worked example

Subject: Operations manager with onboarding improvement experience

Dear Jordan,

I am exploring operations manager roles in the Philadelphia area. At fictional Northline Services, I coordinated an onboarding redesign with three department leads. Our internal checklist records showed that missed handoffs fell from 12 to 5 across two comparable monthly cohorts.

If you support operations searches involving service delivery, would you be open to reviewing my background?
